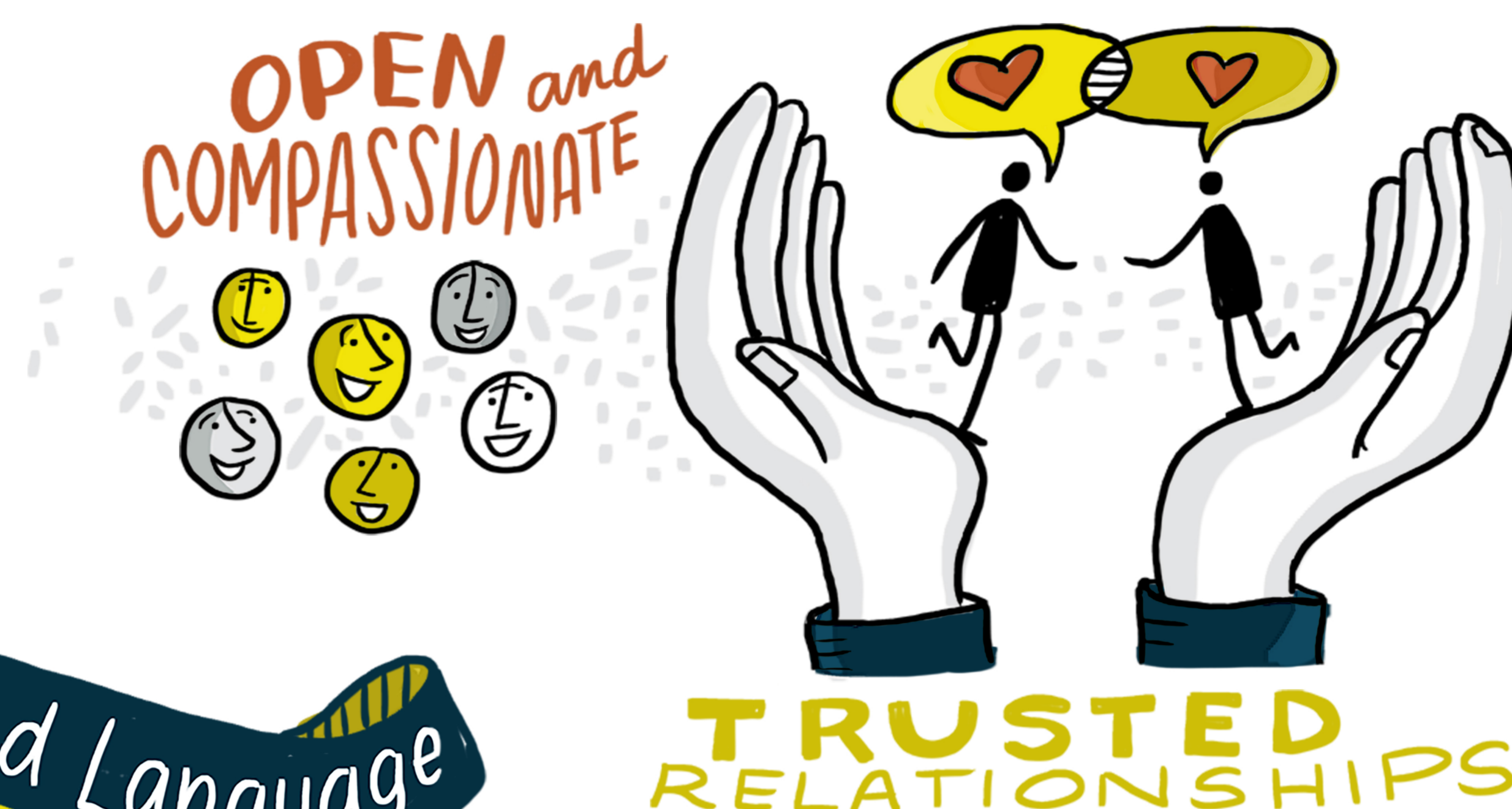
I will focus on the person's wholistic well-being by respecting the role of culture and other influences such as personal experiences and the environment.

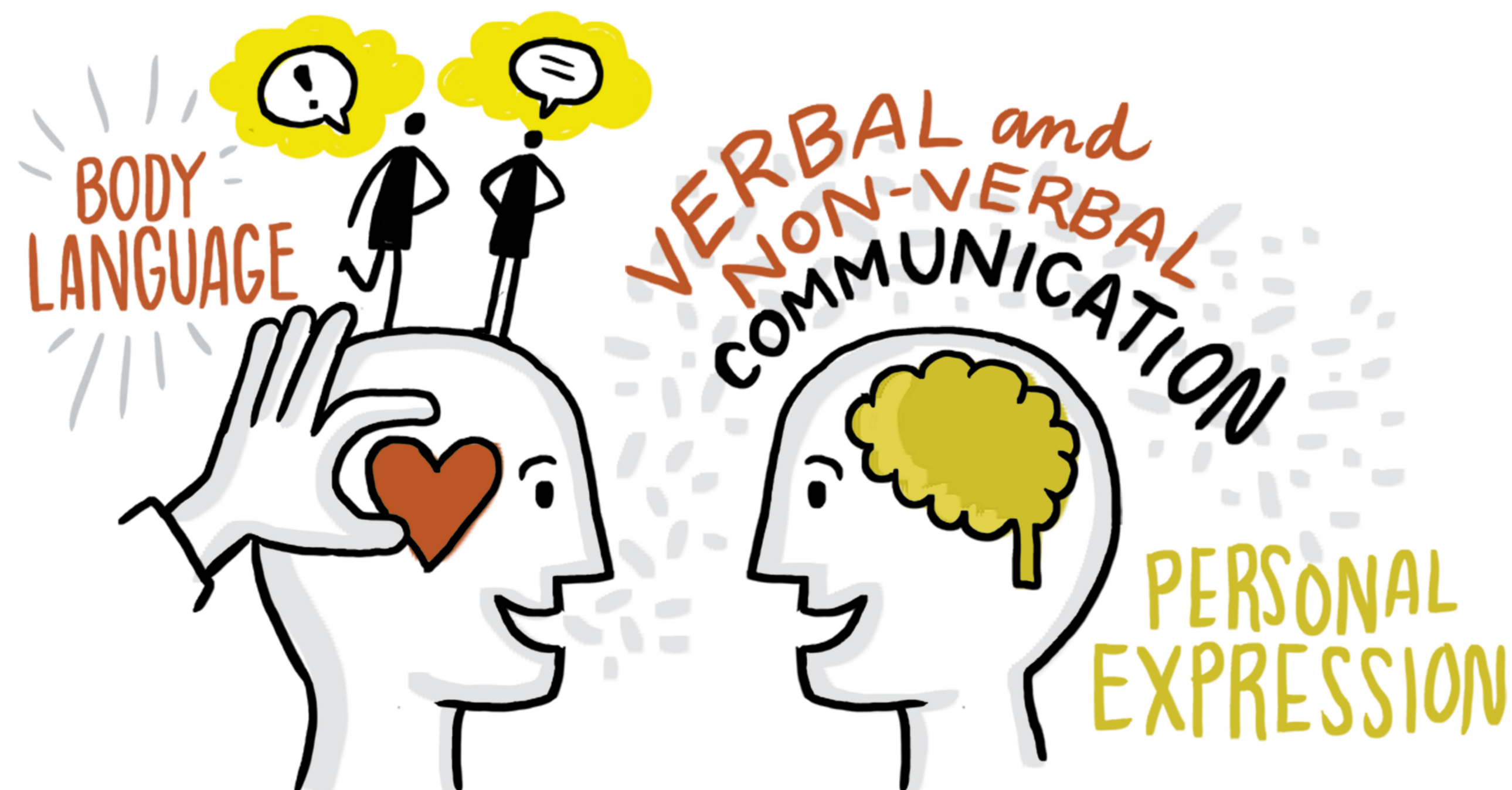
